

At 63, Carla Tjaden, a retired schoolteacher who splits her time between Sioux City, Iowa, and Cocoa Beach, Florida, has had a long and complex health journey shaped by major life events and a struggle to find the right treatment for hormone imbalances.



"In 2008, when I was 47, I had a large fibroid tumor," she said. "The best option at that time was a hysterectomy, and I got advice to go ahead and take out my ovaries because I always had a lot of headaches and they seemed to be hormone-related. I wasn't told anything about hormone replacement therapy (HRT) and immediately after the surgery, I was hit with intense hot flashes, excruciating headaches, and other symptoms."



arla was placed on Premarin, a hormone replacement therapy (HRT) medication that contains a mixture of estrogen hormones, but she hated it.

"It made me do nothing but want to stay in the bedroom and cry all day. I was back teaching in four weeks and just miserable," she said.

Afterward, she searched for better care and found a "hormone guru" in Colorado, where Carla was living at the time, who prescribed a combination of progesterone, DHEA, and estradiol patches. For nearly ten years, that solution worked well enough, but things began to unravel when she slipped on ice and hurt her back just before she retired. After undergoing several surgeries for her injury, her hormone therapy stopped working effectively.

Despite her doctor's best efforts to adjust her dosage, nothing seemed to help, and eventually, she moved to lowa and began searching for a new healthcare provider.

In Iowa, Carla still struggled. She tried hormone creams and patches from a nurse practitioner but couldn't find anything that worked. Frustration built as the treatments failed to bring her relief.

"The nurse practitioner didn't know what she was doing. So, she relied on the pharmacist, and the pharmacist used one method of delivery and that was it," said Carla. "At that point, I was trying testosterone topicals and estradiol patches still."



t wasn't until she discovered bioidentical hormone replacement therapy (BHRT) that things began to change. Armed with her understanding of BHRT, which uses bioidentical hormones that are chemically identical to hormones produced by the body instead of synthetic hormones that are chemically different, she sought treatment in Omaha, Nebraska, where she was prescribed testosterone injections for the first time.


"It was the first time I started feeling any kind of improvement," she said. "So, it was making a positive difference."
However, the clinic only offered rigid dosage regimens that didn't allow for the flexibility Carla needed as someone who lived in two places part-time. Her progress, and patience, soon plateaued.

"As I said, it was the first time I felt any improvement, but it cost me somewhere around \$4,000 to \$4,500 a year to do this and they required me to be in the clinic every two months. When we were in lowa, that wasn't a problem, but I was having to fly back from Florida a couple of times a year," said Carla.

That's when she found EVEXIAS and their EvexiPEL treatment system as she was doing more research into potential care options. She found a clinic in Orlando, Florida that provided The EvexiPEL Method and decided to give it a shot.


who are suffering needlessly because they haven't found the right treatment."
